

How to Spot Fake AI Websites and Scams

Artificial Intelligence has become very popular, and unfortunately some scammers try to take advantage of this by creating **fake AI websites or misleading advertisements**.

These sites may claim to offer AI services but are actually designed to collect personal information or persuade people to pay for services that are unnecessary or fraudulent.

The safest approach is to use only well-known services such as **ChatGPT**, developed by **OpenAI**.

Use the Official Website

The safest place to access ChatGPT is:

chatgpt.com

If you see links to AI services on social media or in advertisements, it is wise to check carefully before clicking them.

Be Cautious of These Warning Signs

A website may be suspicious if it:

- Claims to offer “**miracle AI tools**” or unrealistic promises
- Demands **immediate payment before you can try anything**
- Asks for **bank details or unusual personal information**
- Has a web address that looks slightly wrong (for example, extra words or unusual spelling)
- Uses aggressive messages such as “*Limited time offer — act now!*”

Legitimate services rarely pressure people in this way.

Be Careful With Advertisements

Sometimes online adverts claim things such as:

- “This AI will make you rich”
- “Use this secret AI tool to earn money instantly”
- “The government doesn’t want you to know about this AI”

These types of claims are usually **misleading or fraudulent**.

Avoid Downloading Unknown Software

Many genuine AI tools work **directly in your web browser**. If a website insists that you download unknown software before using AI, it is best to proceed cautiously.

Only install software from **trusted sources**.

Never Share Sensitive Information

You should never enter the following into an AI system or website:

- Bank account details
- Credit card numbers
- Passwords
- Government identification numbers
- Personal financial information

No legitimate AI service needs this information to answer questions.

If You Are Unsure

If you ever feel uncertain about a website:

- Stop and take a moment to check it carefully
- Ask a friend, family member, or someone familiar with technology
- Return to the official website rather than following links

Taking a few extra seconds to check can prevent problems.

A Sensible Approach

Artificial Intelligence can be a **very helpful and interesting tool**, but it should always be used with the same common-sense precautions that apply to any internet service.

By using **official websites**, avoiding suspicious links, and protecting personal information, you can explore AI **safely and confidently**.
